RIO DE JANEIRO ■ Samba Show at Casa das Canoas

CAPE TOWN, SOUTH AFRICA ■ The Ernie Els Winery

Explore the wonderful and fascinating world of wine as seen and enjoyed by South African golfer Ernie Els, one of South Africa’s leading ambassadors and one of the most recognizable faces in the world of sport. Through his many travels around the globe, Ernie has been exposed to and appreciated some of the world’s greatest wines. In 1999, Ernie decided to pursue his developed passion for fine wine with the creation of Ernie Els Wines located in Stellenbosch, the noble heart of the South African wine industry. With the help of award-winning winemaker Louis Strydom, they produced the maiden, 2000 vintage of Ernie Els — a ‘classic’ Bordeaux blend. Guests will have the opportunity to take a peek into the impeccable cellar and also view the Trophy Room, where highlights of Ernie’s golfing achievements are on display. Guests will enjoy hot and cold canapés with a South African flavor while sampling the premium wines that are offered by the winery.



MARCH 1, 2012

HO CHI MINH CITY, VIETNAM ■ Saigon Opera House Cocktails and Performance

The Saigon Opera House is one of the city’s landmarks, located at the end of Le Loi Street. Originally built in 1897 by the French to host opera performances, it was transformed into the South Vietnam Assembly House in 1955. After the nation’s reunification the building remained unused and has recently been refurbished to its former glory. Guests will drive from the pier through central Ho Chi Minh City to the elegant Opera House.

After receiving warm greetings from costumed dancers, guests will tour the venue ending at a private room for canapés and cocktails. A private performance of dance and music will be performed in the main theater.

HONG KONG ■ Cocktails overlooking Victoria Harbour

Dominating the city skyline at more than 1,600 feet high, a new iconic landmark emerges. The Ritz-Carlton, Hong Kong makes a magnificent return to the city with the world’s tallest hotel. VENICE, ITALY ■ Cocktails and Music at the Peggy Guggenheim Collection

Depart by private motor launch to the Peggy Guggenheim Collection, one of Italy’s most vital museums, opened after hours especially for Seabourn full World Cruise Guests. Showcasing Peggy Guggenheim’s personal collection of European and American art of the first half of the 20th Century, the museum was inaugurated in 1980 and is housed in her former home, Palazzo Venier dei Leoni, on the Grand Canal. The museum also presents masterpieces from the Gianni Mattioli Collection, the Nasher Sculpture Garden, and temporary exhibitions. After admiring various masterpieces, enjoy a cocktail and Venetian tapas in the garden overlooking the Grand Canal while being entertained by light jazz music.

JANUARY 15, 2012
RECIFE, BRAZIL ■ Brazilian Cachaça and Folkloric Show

Cachaça, or aguardente, is liquor made from fermented sugarcane, and is the most popular distilled alcoholic beverage in Brazil. The Carvalheira Distillery covers an area of 54,000 square feet and has over 10,000 oak barrels, making it the largest sugar cane spirit aging plant in Brazil. On this Seabourn Complimentary Shore Experience, you will find Carvalheira is a very special place full of charm, history and tradition. Following a 30-minute drive from the pier, tour the facility to learn about the preparation of the white oak barrels, the aging process, quality control, bottling and finally the tasting of the refined *cachaça*. Enjoy cocktails and canapés followed by a Brazilian folkloric show with regional dances such as Frevo, Maracatu, Xaxado, Forro and Ciranda.



FEBRUARY 14, 2012
PORT LOUIS, MAURITIUS ■ A Taste of Mauritius at Eureka Estate

Situated in Moka, at the center of Mauritius, under the slope of Montagne Ory, Eureka Maison Créole is one of the most beautiful and well-preserved colonial dwellings in Mauritius. It is surrounded by grounds reflecting a curious mix of native Mauritian plants with an English-style garden. Constructed from 1812 to 1856, it was converted into a museum in 1986. The house has retained its authentic look both inside and outside, with dramatic views over the river valley. Rooms inside contain period furnishings and household goods of typical island Chinese and Indian homes, reflecting the island's multi-cultural history, as well as antique maps. In this picturesque setting you will enjoy local snacks and special folkloric performances designed to provide you a "taste" of this spectacular island nation, which gained its independence from England in 1968.



MARCH 9, 2012

SHANGHAI, PRC ■ Huangpu River Cruise and Chinese Acrobats

Shanghai is one of the fastest-growing cities on Earth, and the banks of its central Huangpu River are a showcase of both historical colonial-era buildings and some of the world's most imaginative and exotic modern architecture. Take an enjoyable 60-minute cruise on the river, with a local guide who will point out the highlights as they pass on either bank. This passing show is accompanied by Chinese folk music from a band on board, as you also enjoy cocktails and a light dinner. Arriving at the ferry pier, disembark and ride a short way to a theater where you will be amazed by the skill, daring and dazzling artistry of an exclusive performance by the world-renowned Chinese Acrobats of Shanghai.

PHUKET, THAILAND ■ Thai Cultural Village

A festive Welcome Ceremony greets you at the Thai Cultural Village Experience. Ladies adorned in beautiful Thai dresses, a parade of colorfully decorated elephants and the sounds of long drums provide a memorable introduction. Over the next three hours, you are free to discover a wealth of activities representing the very best of Thailand's rich cultural diversity. Watch shows featuring baby elephants and playful monkeys, elegant classical dancers or powerful Thai boxers. Take time to admire the exquisite flower decorations and demonstrations of puppet figure carving, Thai cooking and rubber tree tapping before strolling through the orchid gardens. Sit atop an elephant for a short ride around the village, or enjoy a traditional ox-cart ride. Refreshments and local snacks are provided throughout your stay.

MUSCAT, OMAN ■ Traditional Oman Meze and Entertainment at Barr Al Jissah Shangri-La Hotel

Muscat is a venerable and traditional Omani city, with a waterfront scaled to adorn, rather than out-shine, the rugged surrounding hills. Outside the city, the beautiful Barr Al Jissah Shangri-La Resort is also a shining white homage set against the wind-carved rocks and ridges of the coastline. As you arrive and alight in its pleasant entry, Omani men and women in traditional costume will lead you through this modern, but traditionally styled hotel to the entertainment amphitheater. There, the ancient, lyrical melodies of traditional music played on the Oud, drum, trumpet, and bagpipe will enchant you as you enjoy a refreshment and the delicious small snacks called *meze*. Enjoy the music, the surroundings and perhaps have yourself temporarily embellished with traditional henna designs, before departing to return to Seabourn Quest.
